1. **Two (2)** Application Forms (BDA) duly filled.
2. **Two (2)** **Notarised** photocopies of both parents' passports. The copies of the Kenyan parent's passport must be the **last 4 pages** of the manual passport (including the photo page) **OR** the **last 2 pages** (address and photo page) of the ePassport.
3. **Two (2)** **Notarised** photocopies of the child's International Birth certificate issued by the civil authorities. Ensure that the birth certificate is certified for use abroad (**Überbeglaubigung**)
4. **Two (2)** **Notarised** copies of parents' (international) marriage certificate, if legally married.
5. A non-refundable fee of **€10.00** for each certificate payable only by bank transfer (**Embassy of the Republic of Kenya, IBAN: DE63100400000266014004**) or EC-Debit card at the Embassy. Cash payments will not be accepted. **Overpaid amounts will not be refunded.** Enclose a copy of the bank transfer slip together with the application.
6. **Two (2)** self-addressed, A4-size envelopes (**bearing 1.55 Euros and 4.05 Euros stamps respectively**) for postage purposes.

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NOTES TO PERSON COMPLETING FORM

A birth can be registered only if the following conditions are met:

1. Application for Registration of the Birth outside of Kenya of a child who is a citizen of Kenyan can be made by any person having knowledge of the birth.
2. Documentary evidence should be produced in proof of the birth. A note of the kind of documentary evidence needed is given below.
3. This form should be signed by the applicant and, where there is a Kenyan Mission in the country abroad, countersigned by a member of that mission.

Documentary Evidence (see 2 above)

The documentary evidence to be produced of the birth may be a certificate of birth issued by the appropriate authority in the country abroad, with an English translation of the certificate if it is not in English, or if certificates are not issued in the country abroad, a certificate of the birth given by the Doctor, Midwife or other person who attended the birth.

Where a person is unable to produce satisfactory documentary evidence, the application may still be completed and forwarded to the Registrar who will advise what alternative evidence may be accepted.
